**Summary 3rd Quarter**

- **1256** Hours of direct service provided to individuals
- **55** (unduplicated) Individuals received either assertive outreach, outreach and/or on going supportive services. **68** individuals carried over from last quarter received either assertive outreach, outreach and or ongoing supportive services
- **1** (unduplicated households comprised of 2 members) received either assertive outreach and or ongoing supportive services. **21** Household comprised of **58** members carried over from last quarter received either assertive outreach, outreach and or ongoing supportive services
- **1578** service contacts including assertive outreach, outreach and on going supportive services provided to individuals, ( case load and non case load)
- **370** Hours of service contacts provided to families
- **0** Declined services-indicates a *significant decrease in individuals declining services*

( services to individuals and families were identified separately to better identify needs of families with children)

**Summary of Flex funds**

**2** individuals were assisted with rent

**1** birth certificate

**1** utility assistance

**Other Highlights:**

Ongoing collaboration with co-located agencies, improving communication, decrease duplication of services, improved services delivery.

**Major successes to note: 10 individuals improved their housing status; 4 households made up of 14 members improved their housing status; 5 individuals were employed; 66 received mental health treatment; 7 received drug and alcohol treatment.**

Lack of supportive/transitional vouchers continues to be a significant barrier to the continuum of services. The Outreach team has been successful in assisting individuals to gather identification, complete applications, etc, but there are not subsidy dollars available at this time to house individuals on limited income. The Outreach team has had success working with the dually diagnosed populations, those with substance abuse and mental health issues, with comprehensive wrap around services from community agencies such as LDCHA, DCCCA and Bert Nash CMHC as well as Lawrence Community Shelter staff and Salvation Army staff.
